BIC and ICHCA agree a framework for cooperation

ICHCA International and the Bureau International des Containers et du Transport Intermodal have signed an MoU to provide a framework for cooperation on mutual safety and efficiency related topics

05.12.2016 - ICHCA International, the global cargo handling NGO association, has agreed a framework for cooperation with the Bureau International des Containers et du Transport Intermodal (BIC) in order to work together on matters of joint interest. The two associations signed a formal Memorandum of Understanding on 17th November 2016 at the Intermodal Europe Conference and Exhibition in Rotterdam, the Netherlands.

Founded under the auspices of the International Chamber of Commerce in 1933 as a neutral, non-profit, international NGO, the BIC today has over 2,100 members in 120 countries. The BIC has played an important role in the growth of containerization, with its long-established and active role in the development of industry standards and its appointment by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) in 1972 as the industry's global container prefix registry – a registry further endorsed by international customs conventions. Since 2013, the BIC has also operated the Global ACEP Database under the guidance of the International Maritime Organization (IMO) and in 2016 launched the BoxTech Technical Characteristics Database – a non-profit platform for container technical details built to promote safety and efficiency in the industry.

ICHCA International represents the interests of its voting members, 6,500+ associate members and the global cargo community at large as an NGO with UN regulatory bodies including the IMO, ISO, International Labor Organization (ILO) and UN Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE). Celebrating its 65th anniversary in 2017, the Association provides a focal point for cross-party dialogue and knowledge sharing among different members of the cargo handling chain and promotes good practice in safe and efficient operations across sea, land and air, including containerized, bulk and other cargo types.
